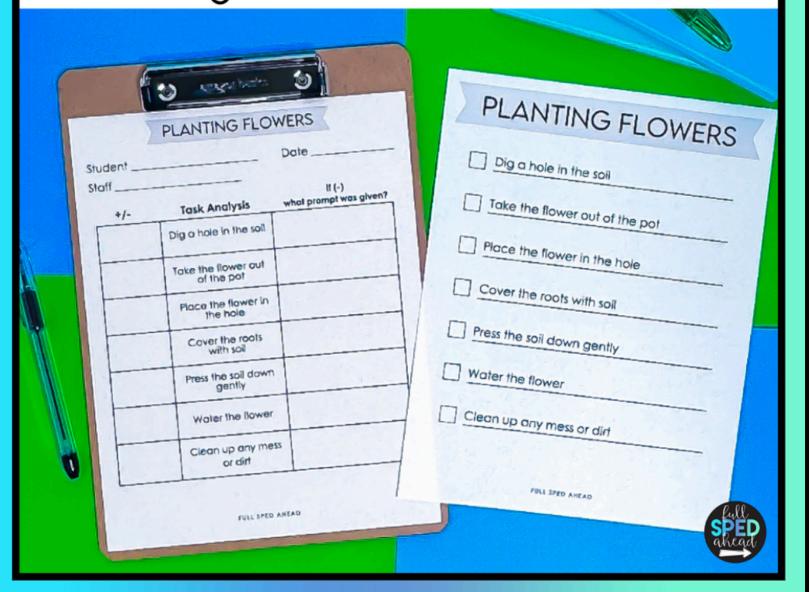

## IEP GOAL SUGGESTIONS

Goal 1: By the end of the IEP year, given verbal or visual prompts, the student will independently gather all necessary gardening materials (e.g., flower seeds or plants, soil, pot, gardening tools, water) before beginning the planting process with 100% accuracy in 4 out of 5 opportunities as measured by teacher observation and data collection.

Goal 2: By the end of the IEP year, given verbal or visual instruction, the student will independently dig an appropriately sized hole in soil or a garden bed for planting flowers with 100% accuracy in 4 out of 5 opportunities as measured by teacher observation and data collection.

Goal 3: By the end of the IEP year, given verbal or visual cues, the student will independently place a flower or seeds in the soil at the correct depth and positions.
